Yr12 Visit to Allied Glass 23rd & 24th April - Mr Brown

Proud of Our Product

As a teacher I am always looking at new ways to excite and engage students, one of those ways is to take students out to a place of interest. When I announced to my Year 12 Engineering students that I was trying to sort out a trip to look at glass being made they were a little sceptical.

Looking around the local area I came across Allied Glass (which, when I was young, was Lax & Shaws). The glass factory is just around the corner from UTC Leeds and a major player in the glass bottle manufacturing world. After a series of e-mails we got an invite to come and see the factory.

We arrived and were met by Simon Stretton and Shaun Woodcock who are training officers within Allied Glass with over 50 years' worth of experience of the industry between them, made the students feel at home. The students were given an overview of the company's history and a safety talk before dressing in their PPE and being escorted around the factory.

Once on the tour of the factory the students were given every opportunity to see every aspect of the manufacturing procedure. They looked at raw product and where the glass was heated. They looked at the machines that were making the bottles. They observed quality checks and inspect. The annealing process and why it has to be done. At one point they watched a tool change over, where they saw the team work that is required to carry out this task and the safety provisions that have to be met to ensure the safety of the workforce. They worked together each knowing their role, each one knowing the importance of working safely together.

The inspection process where even the smallest imperfection leads to a reject and how the material is not wasted, but recycled, was good for the students to see. To feel the heat, the smells looking at the different aspects of glass making and most of all the information given to them by Simon and Shaun as they went around the factory. This was an excellent tour that gave the students so much more information than they can get from being in a classroom.

As we spoke to different people around the site you could see how proud of their product they were, knowing they were working for a company who are seen as trustworthy in the industry and prides itself on the quality of the product that they send out into the market place.
